

## R.I.P. RIK VAN LOOY

We all know that one day our lives will come to an end. When someone has passed the age of ninety, people often say, "It's a nice age." But whichever way you look at it, it is a final goodbye, during which memories often surface. In the case of the death of Rik Van Looy, there are many. He was (we must switch to the past tense) one of the great Belgian cycling luminaries. His name is mentioned in the same breath with those of Eddy Merckx, Rik Van Steenbergen, Roger De Vlaeminck but also with the older names such as, for example, Luciën Buysse, Sylvère Maes and Briek Schotte. Recently, his string of victories has been widely reported in the press and on television. In all sorts of ways he has already been adulated. That after Merckx he was one of the very best Belgian riders ever, everyone agrees. Of course we cannot ignore his victories in the great classics: Milan-San

Paris-Roubaix (1961, 1962, 1965), Liege-Bastogne-Liege (1961), Tour of Lombardy (1959) and his world titles in 1960 and 1961.

Van Looy concludes his cycling career with the Dutch Willem II-Gazelle.team, for which he won in 1967: 19, in 1968: 17, 1969: 19 and in 1970 two victories. The most appealing victories from that period are Paris-Tours in 1967, Waalse Pijl in 1968 and in 1969 the E3 Prijs Harelbeke. With the team, he is by far the rider with the largest annual salary. In 1969, he is on the payroll for one million Belgian francs. Of course, everything should be reflected on the wage situation of that time. Noiselessly, he bids farewell to cycling in 1970. "I didn't feel like crawling on the bike every day anymore. A second reason was that I no longer felt at home among all those strange riders. My friends and also my enemies weren't cycling anymore. I appeared like a 'bompa' at the start among a bunch of young brats whose father I could have been."

Then there are the personal memories. With a number of journalists, we were invited on September 8, 2006, to be present at the opening of the Rik Van Looy cycling route from the Bloso Center in Herentals, Via his hometown of Grobbendonk, the route runs via Zandhoven,

Ranst, Wijnegem, Schoten,

Brecht, Rijkevorsel, Malle, Beerse, Lille and so back to Herentals. Taking turns, we were able to ride with the Emperor of Herentals for a few kilometers at the head of the group of about 25 men. I had that honor on the long straight along the Albert Canal. Those kilometers are etched in my memory. After all, riding alongside and with such a great champion doesn't happen to you every day! Van Looy composed the route himself, and a few things were important to him. First, it must be safe and second, it must be pleasant. Everyone must be able to enjoy it in his or her own way.

Then we got to meet Rik again at the presentation of the book written by Mark Vanlombeek and Robert Janssens on the occasion of his 80th birthday.


Now everything is truly in the past, but the memories of this great driver will remain.

# WHERE ARE THE LIMITS OF TALENT BOY THIBAU NYS?

#### Like father like son?

It was once the title of a popular TV show among our northern neighbors. In contemporary cycling, there are also sons who follow in their father's footsteps. Wellknown examples include David and Erik Dekker, Mathieu and Adrie van der Poel, Nicolas and Alexandre Vinokourov and Boy and Jean-Paul van Poppel. In Flanders, Thibau and Sven Nys are undoubtedly the couple most in the spotlight. Both are top cyclists but Thibau's results on the road cannot be matched by father Sven. During the road season and the first half of the cross season, we rode with the 'little Cannibal' and we also look ahead.

## Still passionate about cross country

We go back for a moment to September 2023 and the beginning of the then cyclocross season. It got off to a flying start for Thibau Nys. In his first five races, he immediately took three wins: in the B-Mine cross in Beringen, the UCI World Cup race in Waterloo, USA, and the Koppenberg cross. His victory in Waterloo was a nice gift for one of his team's sponsors. After all, Waterloo is the home of bike manufacturer Trek. After that very good start, however, he could not continue that strong line. He wasn't satisfied with that either, but in hindsight he felt he had made a nice step.

#### The 2024 road program

By the way, the first part of his road program, with the Tours of Roman-

dy, Hungary and Norway, was almost identical to that of 2023. With second places in stages of the first two rounds and a win in the one in Norway (his first as a pro), he was already quite successful then. But in 2024 he will be at the start with even more ambition, as he wants to perform in every race.

#### The first World Tour win

After the tough 2023 cyclocross season, Nys took the necessary rest after the world championships in Tábor, to prepare for his first road season as a pro with World Tour team Lidl-Trek. After an altitude training in Tenerife, the now 21-year-old Thibau was at the start of his first road race of the season, the Swiss Tour de Romandie, at the end of April. In the second stage he was in the early breakaway for the first time in his career. And it carried right to the end. With a strong final sprint with three uphill he took his


first victory in the World Tour and immediately got to put on the leader's jersey as well. "I felt really super good on that final climb. I will remember this for the rest of my life". It became clear right away: After a tough race and in a final uphill sprint, he is hard to beat.

#### Like a Puszta rider through the Hungarian land

Just over a week later he was already at the start of the five-day Tour of Hungary. The history of this relatively unknown race dates back to 1925. The course is certainly not easy. After the first flat stage there was a lot of climbing to do. The finish of the last three stages was uphill. That jacket seemed to fit Thibau just fine. With a strong final sprint he won the third stage and also took the leader's jersey. A day later he did the same and strengthened his leading position. In the last stage he was not in danger anymore and

so he wrote the first cycle race on his palmares.

Mark Cavendish was also riding in this round. He finished second in the points classification after Thibau. It was his penultimate preparation race before the Tour de France in which he finally took the record for the number of stage wins (35).

#### On to the far north

In the first stage of the Tour of Norway, it was an instant hit for Nys. The climb of almost 4 km at an average of 6% to the finish was a piece of cake for him. And he was also the first holder of the leader's jersey. In this race Wout van Aert also made his comeback after his heavy fall in Dwars door Vlaanderen.

#### The Tour of Switzerland

For many riders, this race is the very last test before the Tour de France. But for Thibau it was the preparation for the Belgian championship with which he ended the first part of his road season with a nice 4th place. In the final kilometers of the third stage, Nys sees his chance. When Wilco Kelderman takes off he picks his wheel. In the last 150 meters on the uphill finish in Rüschlikon, Nys sets the pace and wins the sprint convincingly. This gives him his sixth win of the season. He keeps Stephen Williams and Alberto Bettiol behind him. "I had been thinking about this stage for some time. I also knew after the reconnaissance that this would be something for me. This is more than a dream and that comes with emotions. This is my best win so far." Once again, proof of how strong he is on finishes like these.

#### Three times is a charm

In the Tour of Poland, Thibau resumed his road season. And in

what a way. Here, too, he found his beloved finishes: "fairly short and very steep or three to four kilometers of not too steep climbing." There he won the first (final climb 450 m at 3.6%), third (900 m at 8.1%) and sixth stage (3 km at 5%) The latter was then also the queen stage. And in the process he beat the top riders of the peloton such as Kelderman, Ulissi, Vingegaard and Mohorič.

#### The last of the road season

His last road race was the Bretagne Classic-Quest-France in which he finished fifth. Afterwards, he said there might have been more in it: "Physically, I had one of my best days this year, but I gambled at a moment where I probably shouldn't have. With that I lost the race". It is once again clear that Thibau has taken a big step.

## 'You know who is calling?' Cross is calling'

In every round he participated in, he won a ride. A flying start at the very highest level. If he wants to compete for a final victory in a tour he will have to invest more in his time trial. In Hungary that was not the case. But he doesn't want to leave cross-country racing as his first love for the time being. That is still too much his playground. We had already prepared our bones and thick winter coat.

#### Also a flying start in the cross

After his last road race and a rest period of almost two months, Thibau rode his first cross in Beringen. He consciously chose to ride only



one cyclocross per weekend this season. An understandable choice in connection with his ambitions on the road. In his first six cyclo-cross events, he already achieved three victories. Cherry on the cake was of course the European title in Pontevreda, Spain. After a riveting battle, he settled in the last lap by

jumping over the bars with the surprisingly strong "home rider" Felipe Orts Lloret.

#### Pursued by bad luck....

Immediately after the European Championship, he adds lustre to his star jersey with the victory in Lokeren. But then, just like last year, we see a downward trend in his performance. In Hamme a crash made it impossible to have a good result. During the World Cup in Dublin he also went down in the chaos caused by Czech Boros' fall on the bars and was hit by another rider. After a stage with the Lidl-Trek road team in





Calpe, he was present again in Namur but there two flat tires prevented him from being at the front of the results. We cannot deny that a dose of bad luck can explain his lesser performance.

Of one thing, however, we are certain: Thibau will turn out a few more times this cyclocross season. Will he peak at the right time and will luck be on his side at the championships? The one who can come closest to Mathieu van der Poel at the upcoming World Championships is a Thibau Nys in top condition. By the time you have this magazine in your hands, the answer has already been given.

# Will he **peak**at the **right** time and will **luck** be on his side at the **championships**?

#### **Debut in the Ardennes classics?**

On the road, he will focus on the Walloon classics for the 2025 season so he can have a rest and training period after the cyclo-cross season. In any case, he has already ticked off the Flèche Wallonne.

## Where would be the limits of this talent boy?

No one at this time can give a meaningful answer to this question. All that we would write - and sometimes read about - is speculation. Therefore, let us wait quietly and not put too much pressure on Thibau. Maybe we should first learn to enjoy what he has already shown. Enjoy those wonderful achievements before immediately asking what he could win in the future. In a few years, the answer to our question will follow.


Good luck Thibau and above all, enjoy it yourself!

## THE ICING ON THE CAKE FOR VICTOR CAMPENAERTS

The end of the road season is the time for honoring our cycling stars. They also have this tradition in cycling-loving Gavere, East Flanders. During an intimate gathering at the town hall, local rider Victor Campenaerts was honored for his stage win in the 18th stage of the Tour de France between Gap and Barcelonette, which he had long anticipated.

In the sprint he beat Frenchman Vercher and Pole Kwiatkowski after a tough stage with no fewer than six 3rd category climbs. The emotional release after the line at the sight of his son Gustaaf, born in June during an altitude training camp in Spain, provided unforgettable images. For Victor, this victory fulfilled a long-cherished dream. And as befits a good teammate, Victor also included Brent Van Moer in the homage to thank him for all the work he did for him and the team during the Tour de France.





#### **Succession assured**

Mayor Dierick handed Gustaaf a bodysuit with the Belgian colors that Victor had been allowed to defend during the World Cup in Zurich, Switzerland. After all, you can't get infected with the cycling bug early enough. And the Col du Campi, located in front of the town hall, is a great place to cover the first meters on a bike with dad and training wheels.

#### Firefighter-to-be?

In 2025, Victor will make a three-year move to Visma-Lease-a-bike, the team for which he rode before. Yet he is also already thinking about the period after his cycling career. According to him, the profession of firefighter is right up his alley. And the barracks in Gavere are only a stone's throw from his home. But first let's see if Victor, like his fellow townsman Thomas De Gendt, succeeds in completing the triple with a stage victory in the Vuelta. In any case, that wish has already been toasted with a local Valeir.

## **TEAM TACTICS IN OPTIMA FORMA**



'Tis wonderful to see on the tube how a team executes a piece of team tactics. Are they pre-conceived plans or does a situation arise spontaneously in the race? How is the game played and how does it eventually lead to results or victory? We will briefly recall two moments from the past cycling year 2024: one in the men's and one in the women's.

## Frank van den Broek & Romain Bardet (Team dsm-firmenichPostNL)

We go back to the first stage of the 2024 Tour de France: Florence-Rimini. Over a distance of 206 km there are three second category cols and four third category. After about fifteen kilometers, Tour debutant Frank van den Broek, Ion Izagirre, Valentin Madouas, Matej Mohoric, Clément Champoussin, among others, set off. Later, Ryan Gibbons and Johann Abrahamsen join. The climbing caused the

group to gradually shrink. On the Côte de San Leo (575 m. 5 km at 7.4%), only Madouas, Abrahamsen and Van den Broek are still in the lead. Then follows a beautiful piece of cycling. Romain Bardet, the leader of dsm-firmenichPost-NL, breaks away from the peloton and hunts down the three leaders. Van den Broek drops back to catch his leader. A perfect scenario follows. The two join Madouas and Abrahamsen, Soon Abrahamsen has to pass. On the Côte de Montemaggio (519 m. 4.3 km at 6.7%) the lights go out for Madouas too. The road to Rimini then lies open for the two teammates. At the top of the Côte de San Marino (651 m. 7 km at 4.8%), their lead is over a minute and a half. Downhill, there are then 27 kilometers to go. The big question is whether the two can hold their own against the chasing



pack behind them. With three kilometers to go, only twenty seconds remain. Van den Broek enters the final kilometer first. Will the rookie win after all? No. There is such a thing as hierarchy. The photos of the finish, which have eternal

value, show it beautifully. Leader Bardet has a small lead, but both make the victory gesture and with an outstretched hand they thank each other. Then from surprise both hands on the head. Merci beaucoup. Five seconds later, Wout van Aert wins the sprint from the chasers. Bardet, who is on his last season comes into yellow. Van den



Broek gets to cloak himself in the green of the points classification the next day and, as best young rider, is also winner of the white jersey, and on top of all that, there is the prize of combativeness for him. As a Tour debutant, you couldn't wish for a better start. Truly a boyhood dream. Bardet may have the stage and the yellow jersey but Van den Broek is the man of the day due to his long escape and will be celebrated in the After-Tour criteriums after returning home.

## Lotte Kopecky & Lorena Wiebes (Team SD Worx-Protime)

After her world title and second place at the World Gravel Championships, the Simac Ladies Tour is scheduled as the final race of the season between Oct. 8 and 13. Lorena Wiebes wins the second, third and fifth stages. The standings then are; In the lead Franziska Kooi (Team dsm firmenich PostNL), at

five seconds Zoë Bäckstedt (Canyon/SRAM Racing) and third at eight seconds Lotte Kopecky. With her fifth place at fifteen seconds, sprint star Lorena Wiebes can no longer win the Simac Ladies Tour. Going in a breakaway may not be in the cards. That is why all the cards are being put on Kopecky. First, the team will make sure the entire pack stays together so there can be a sprint. Wiebes will be the last to put Kopecky, who needs the bonification seconds, in a good position. The play succeeds. Kopecky takes the stage win, the bonification seconds and, as in 2023, the overall victory. All in all, an example of clever team play. With her speed, Wiebes could have easily taken her fourth stage win here. She will benefit from such shifts in reverse at some point in the coming years. What goes around comes around!

At the end of the year, there are many ways to take stock. In cycling, the riders, coaches and teams will look back on the season and see if it brought what was thought and hoped for beforehand. The cycling fan looks back in a different way. First and foremost is what he/she enjoyed most. Which moments are forever remembered. What has been of lasting value. Everyone has his/her own summation. We are going to unravel the season once again and take the UCI ranking as a basis. Naturally then the big names pass by: Tadej Pogačar, Remco Evenepoel, Jasper Philipsen, Matthieu van der Poel. These are men who have achieved great performances this season. Unforgettable! Among the ladies, we draw attention to three riders from the Sd-Worx Team: Lotte Kopecky, Demi Vollering, Lorena Wiebes along with Italian Elisa Longo Borghini.

#### Tadej Pogačar

Since September 2021, Tadej Pogačar is the undisputed leader of the UCI rankings. What a season he has had again this year! It starts with his win in the Strade Bianche on March 2. Then he wins all the jerseys in the Volta Ciclista a Catalunya and wins Liège-Bastogne-Liège on April 21. Then follows his win in the Giro d'Italia including the mountain classification and six stages. In the Tour de France, he also wins six stages and, of course, the overall classification. He ends the year with an incredible series: Sept. 15 GP Montréal, Sept. 29 World Championship in Zurich and then in the rainbow jersey his victories in the Giro dell'Emilia (Oct. 5) and the Tour of Lombardy (Oct. 12). Attached to all the one-day victories is the story of great breakaways after splitting demarrages. It all starts in the Strade Bianche with an 80-kilometer solo. In the world championship, he does it with 100 kilometers to go. He just drops everyone as if it



is no effort. With the rainbow jersey around his shoulders he repeats this trick in the Giro dell'Emilia on October 5. he sets off on the San Luca with 35 kilometers to go and no one will see him again. In the Tour of Lombardy, he repeated the trick once again. Everything happens on Colma di Sormano. Pogačar and his mates closed the gap to a disintegrated breakaway group on the climb. The summit is 6.6 kilometers away and the distance to the finish is 48.4 kilometers. It is the moment for Pogačar. He immediately attacks and no one follows or can follow him. At the top, his lead over a chasing group with Evenepoel, Mas and Van Eetveld is already 01'09". The bird has flown. His ride to Como is a true demonstration. After 2021, 2022 and 2023, it is his fourth win in the round of falling leaves. Evenepoel comes second at 03'16" and third man Giulio Ciccone finishes at 04'31" What differences! Pogačar is a phenomenon!

UCI victories 2024: 25

#### Remco Evenepoel

Of course, we will also not forget the successes of Remco Evenepoel in 2024. He is second in the UCI world rankings. Leading the way, of course, are his two gold medals at the Paris Olympics in both the time trial and the road race. But that's not all because a month and a half later he also becomes world time trial champion. In the Tour de France, he becomes winner of the time trial Nuits St. Georges-Gevrey Chambertin and also takes the white junior jersey to Belgium. He also wins the time trial in the Critérium du Dauphiné. In February everything started with a win in the time trial and the overall classification in the Tour of the Algarve. Conclusion: Evenepoel is the best time trialist of 2024!

UCI victories 2024: 9

#### **Jasper Philipsen**

On the UCI World Ranking List dated Oct. 22, 2024, sprinter Jas-





per Philipsen is in third place. The basis for this ranking is his win on March 16 in Milan-Sanremo. Before then, he has already won a stage in the Tirreno-Adriatico. The Classic Brugge-De Panne is his next prey. Next up is a stage win in the Baloise Belgium Tour. In the Tour de France, there are three stage wins. In most cases, Mathieu van der Poel

is the last man to pull the sprint for him. His latest win is on Oct. 3 in the Sparkassen Münsterland Giro, but above all, Milan-Sanremo is the big hit!

UCI victories 2024: 9

#### Mathieu van der Poel

We start but in early spring, be-

cause that's when world champion Mathieu van der Poel shows a wonderful piece of cycling. It has been much said that wearing the rainbow jersey is a curse. Just think of the 2012 world champion Philippe Gilbert not scoring his first win until a year later, Sept. 5, 2013, at the Vuelta a España. Van der Poel sets an incredible run. He



wins the E3 Saxo Classic, the Tour of Flanders and Paris-Roubaix. That's making cycling history. On the UCI world ranking, there is a fifth place for him.

UCI victories 2024: 4

#### **Lotte Kopecky**

She is the undisputed leader of UCI World Ranking 2024. In total, she records 16 victories. In the spring, she is best in the Tour of United Arab




Emirates, Strade Bianche, Nokere Koerse and Paris-Roubaix. She then wrote the Tour of Britain to her name and became Belgian champion in the time trial and on the road. If that wasn't enough, she won the Tour de Romandie, the European time trial championships and, as the icing on the cake, the world road championships. Then also a second place in the World Gravel Championships. Finally, as the new world champion, she also won the Simac Ladies Tour in October.

UCI victories 2024: 16

#### **Demi Vollering**

Second in the UCI World Ranking but still she will not be satisfied and that will be because of her second place in the Tour de France Feminin. The year starts well with overall wins in the stage races Vuelta a España Femenina, Itzula Women, Vuelta a Burgos Femmes and the Tour de Suisse Women. Then the Tour starting in Rotterdam. The second day there she wins the time







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trial and immediately captures the yellow jersey. In the fifth stage she loses the lead in the general classification due to a fall, which is taken over by Katarzyna Niewiadoma. Vollering is then ninth with and arrears of 01'19". In the sixth stage she nibbles another four seconds off her deficit. Everything has to happen in the final stage to the Alpe d'Huez. It will be a battle between Vollering and Rooyakkers with Niewiadoma in the background. Vollering wins the stage and then it's waiting for the Polish rider who finishes fourth at 01'01". Then the calculation is quickly made: Niewiadoma wins by four seconds ahead of Vollering. A denouement that will be recorded in the Tour books in golden letters! The eight-second difference between Greg Lemond and Laurent Fignon in the 1989 Tour de France is immediately relegated to second place.

UCI victories 2024: 15

#### Elisa Longo Borghini

The 32-year-old Italian is one

of the leading ladies in the peloton. She is strong in oneday races, but can also digest a multi-day stage race well. Last year, she set a fine series starting with wins in both the Tour of Flanders and the Brabantse Pijl. Before starting in the Giro d'Italia Women, she becomes Italian champion on the road. On July 7, she wins time trial in the Giro, laying a decent foundation for the overall win. All days she remains overall leader. At the tally, she has a 00'21"' lead over Lotte Kopecky. At the beginning of October, after her third place in the World Championships, she wins the Giro dell'Emilia. The total sum results in third place in the UCI World Rankings.

UCI victories 2024: 7

#### **Lorena Wiebes**

By far, she is the fastest sprinter in the peloton. Her first big wins in 2024 are the Tour of Drenthe (March 10), Ghent-Wevelgem (March 24) and the Scheldeprijs (April 3). She also stands her ground in

multi-day races with wins in the Ride London Classic (May 24-26) and the Baloise Ladies Tour(July 17-21). In September she became European champion on the road and also won the Dutch gravel championship. Finally, she makes her mark with three stage wins in the Simac Ladies Tour. With 23 victories, she is one of the top riders in contemporary national and international women's cycling. To top it off, she also becomes world scratch champion without any track experience in Ballerup, Denmark.



you want to take on a big challenge. The routes have also been carefully chosen. For the adventurous cyclist, there are technical descents and challenging climbs, such as the Sa Calobra - an iconic climb with hairpin after hairpin that makes you feel like you're in a race. But the more recreational routes are also impressive. You can cycle leisurely along the coast or through the flat inlands, where the scents of wild herbs and flowering orange trees keep you company.

Along the way, the guide will tell you about the region. Did you know



that most oranges here are not used for export, but in local dishes? Or that there are villages where time seems to stand still? You don't just bike, you really get to know the island.

## Super lightweight set of climbing wheels The Streem Aero wheel set from Newmen



Newmen stands for innovative and high-quality wheels and bike-parts produced entirely in Germany. We took a closer look at the brand's Streem Aero set.

The Streem Aero wheelset is the lightest wheelset in the Newmen range and is made for the mountains. The set combines a 35 mm rim on the front wheel with 38 mm tread height on the rear wheel. The inner rim width of 22 mm is perfect for modern tires up to 28 mm wide. Thanks to the outer width of 29.5 mm, the Streem Climbing maintains its top aerodynamic values even with wide tires.

The most important link is the VONOA Aerowide carbon spokes. Not only do they weigh 40 percent less than comparable steel spokes, they are also significantly stiffer. As a result, the front wheel needs only 15 spokes, while 18 aero carbon spokes create a stiff rear wheel.

For less air turbulence, they at Newmen also created the integrated aero valve, which disappears completely into the carbon rim. The result: better aerodynamics, cleaner look. The 1035-gram Streem Climbing set is therefore not only a topper for mountain stages, but also an ultralight all-rounder with uncompromising aerodynamics.

## U.SCANINI 922 ROAD FRAME Is unknown really unloved?



The Belgian bicycle brand U.Scanini has been producing frames since 1986, but if you ask the average cycling tourist if they know the brand, the answer will usually be negative. However, U.Scanini is actually the very first bike brand in Belgium to launch carbon frames on the market. The brand started with chromolybdenum frames, then moved on to aluminum, titanium and then U.Scanini became a true Belgian pioneer of carbon frames. Those first carbon frames consisted of glued carbon with alu lugs and a few years later the first monocoque

carbon frames were launched under the name U.Scanini 911.

## So how come the brand doesn't sound very familiar?

Well, simply because marketing and creating brand awareness was not on the producer's program. You can find the frame on the market under the brand name U.Scanini, but more so under the private label of bike stores that market their own brand with quality frames. So maybe you are cycling on a U.Scanini without even knowing it?....

#### New frame 922

In the summer of 2024, U.Scanini launched the sale of the new 922 frame. A monocoque frame manufactured in T800S carbon. The model delivered to Cyclelive Magazine which we will test intensively in the coming months and of which a test report will follow later - was equipped with Shimano Ultegra DI2 and carbon wheels from SX Force. The frames are made in Asia, completely according to the wishes and geometry of the manufacturer and has following characteristics:





# Concept store or multi-brand? FOR CUBE STORE FLANDERS, THERE IS NO DOUBT



The phenomenon of concept stores focusing entirely on one brand has been present in Belgium since 2010 when the first concept store in Flanders opened its doors in Westerlo. Recently, we were invited to the opening of Cube Store Flanders in Torhout, where we were introduced to this still not so common formula ourselves.

Where most bicycle retailers represent multiple brands in order to offer a larger selection to customers, concept stores go in the other direction. They argue that just specializing in one brand makes a big difference to the end customer. At Cube store Flanders, the opening in Torhout was a follow-up to the first Cube store that owner Thomas Vauter opened in Harelbeke in 2020.

We were eager to learn more about the philosophy behind the story of the inspirer who dared to open a second Cube Store in hard times.

### Hello Thomas, tell us a little bit about how you got into the bike business.

"After my studies in Barcelona and Lille, I joined my father's construction company and started working there as a site manager for several years. My interest in cycling at that time was rather recreational.

About four years ago, I started looking for something different. It was a bit of out of the box thinking for me then to take my professional career in a different direction.

Mobility was completely changing in cities by then. Bike lanes were popping up bicycle reimbursement was being promoted in full force, etc.

So it seemed like a good idea to get into the bike business."

### So how did you end up at Cube?

"We were friends with Cube's importer in Belgium, Dirk Clinquant. At a nice dinner, after a while, we talked about doing business and how we saw the future. And so we came to the subject of the "Cube Store" concept.".

In Germany, they had asked Dirk whether their concept of stores could also be rolled out in Belgium. It was not so simple for him to con-


vince someone with an existing store - which in Belgium are almost all Multi brand - to start with one brand.

As I was driving home after our conversation, everything still stuck a bit and I started to do some research around Cube's concept story in Germany.

My vision even then was that the bicycle industry would quickly evolve toward the automotive story, where brands all have large garages built to the brand's standards in order to provide optimal service to their customers."

### Yet did you not hesitate for a moment about multi-brands?

"Actually no. When I saw how super strong Cube was in the price/ quality ratio, I very quickly became fully convinced that with a professional approach it would really be an added value to be fully specialized in one top brand.



And yes, sometimes you have to dare to jump into deep water and then swim until you reach dry land, right?

### Then you started the first Cube Store in Belgium in the beautiful building in Harelbeke on Gentsesteenweg?

"No not at all, we first started in a smaller store. I built that smaller building myself with the help of my brother and a friend. The fact that we came from the construction industry was of course useful for that.

Then Corona immediately provided a huge boost, because everyone wanted a bike. As a result, we redid everything a good year later. We built again, but a bigger building in a prime location at Gentsesteenweg 212 in Harelbeke."

### Still, it's a bit like putting all your eggs in one basket at Cube, isn't it?

"It is indeed a bit of an unwritten rule in the Business world that it is best never to depend on one big supplier or one big customer. So this goes against that rule.

On the other hand, that's just the idea of the concept. As I said, it's "out of the box" thinking, a bit against the grain. There is no doubt, however, that the after-service benefits. Our employees really know the brand and all of our products inside and out. That is simply not possible when you have several brands with all their specific know-how and requirements. The customer reaps the benefits at the end of the day, and that is ultimately the intention.



"No, not for a single moment. I saw how, partly through the sponsorship of the Intermarché - Wanty cycling team, Cube became more popular year after year and began to gain a larger and larger share of the market. That convinced me to stick to the vision and strategy of the Cube concept.

My ambition is to be the biggest and best in Belgium in offering Cube, both to show models in the





showroom, and in terms of stock and after-sales service."

### So your ambition then left you to open the second Cube Store, surely a risk in turbulent times for the bike industry?

"To be honest, ever since the first day I started the Cube Store, I had the idea of eventually having multiple stores. That way of thinking is also something I kind of inherited from home.

That it is a difficult period right now in the bicycle business is true, but of course that is just the challenge of entrepreneurship.

Also, I believe very strongly in Cube as a brand. There is a lot of talk in the industry about a general oversupply of bikes, but sometimes you have to dig a little deeper.

I am convinced that among the real price/quality bike brands, there is not that much oversupply on the market! The problem is mostly with the less highly regarded brands or those that are way overpriced relative to what they offer. At least that's how we feel it at Cube anyway."

### So then in the following years there will no doubt follow another opening?

"If the opportunity presents itself why not? Only it should not be at the expense of the customer. We must continue to give the service our customers are now used to from us and even improve it. That is the main thing before thinking of expanding further."

Thank you Thomas for the insight you gave us into the concept and philosophy of the Cube Stores. We wish you every success!



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### 13<sup>th</sup> edition **Arlberg Giro 2025**Racing in the heart of the Austrian Alps



In 2025, the small but renowned town of St. Anton am Arlberg will once again become the epicenter of the Austrian cycling world for a while. The 13th Arlberg Giro will take place on August 3, 2025 and attract 1,500 (former) professional and amateur cyclists from all over the world.

The ARLBERG Giro is widely regarded as one of the most spectacular

cycling races in the Austrian Alpine region. The 150-kilometer course, with an altitude difference of 2,500 meters, presents an enormous challenge while showcasing the breathtaking beauty of the Alps. From winding mountain roads to majestic vistas, the route combines technical difficulty with breathtaking scenery, making it one of the top races.

The race starts in St. Anton am Arlberg and the action begins almost immediately with the ascent of the Arlberg Pass. With gradients of up to 15%, it immediately hits the participants hard. After overcoming this initial challenge, cyclists are rewarded with a fast descent to Bludenz, which offers a brief respite. But the toughest climb then already lurks: the as-

cent of Montafon, a grueling 15 kilometers uphill where even an additional challenge awaits.

This section is not only physically demanding, but also brings that extra touch of competition, as the fastest cyclists on this climb earn the prestigious titles of "Queen and King of the Mountain." The climb rewards participants with panoramic views of the surrounding Alpine peaks, a moment of awe amidst the mountains.

Once the riders reach the highest point of the race, the Bielerhöhe at an altitude of 2,032 meters, the descent begins along the famous Silvretta High Alpine Road. This descent leads to the Paznaun Valley and then through the Stanzertal and brings the cyclists back to St. Anton. There they are greeted by cheering spectators as they sprint to the finish line.

### Additional races - highlights outside the main event

The ARLBERG Giro is more than a one-day event. Two additional races offer excitement for both participants and spectators and provide a weekend full of cycling action.

### St. Anton Night sprint (1 august 2025)

This exciting sporting event takes place on the Friday evening before the main race. Then 100 men and 100 women compete in individual sprints over a 200-meter course in the heart of St. Anton's pedestrian zone. Participants race against the clock and try to secure a spot in the top 16, advancing to the elimination rounds.

The final rounds follow a knockout system, with the fastest drivers competing against each other under the dramatic glow of a light show at dusk. The exciting atmosphere, combined with the close-quarters racing, guarantees an unforgettable experience for participants and fans alike. The top three men and three women will be crowned champions of this premier sporting event. In addition, the top 10 finishers in











each category will receive a coveted starting spot in Block A for the ARLBERG Giro on Sunday.

### International cycling criterion (2 august 2025)

The evening before the main race, another adrenaline-boosting event takes place in St. Anton: the International Cycling Criterium. In this prestigious race, elite teams from all over the world compete on a technically demanding course that winds through the village center.

The criterium begins with the women's race, where cyclists demonstrate their skill, speed and determination as they ride through sharp turns and challenging sections. The men's race follows shortly after, with equally intense action....

The start and finish line in front of City Hall offers spectators an excellent view of the race. For participants and fans alike, the criterium is an exciting warm-up to the main event.

### A weekend full of cycling, celebration and alpine charm!

The ARLBERG Giro 2025 is not just a race, it is a celebration of Austrian cycling culture, the beauty of the Alps and a Tyrolean-style social event. 

Imagine three days of pure thrills, five mountain passes with breathtaking views, 221 kilometers full of challenges and over 4,500 altimeters. This is the Engadin Cycling Marathon, an event that makes many cyclist's heart beat faster. This impres-

sive event leads from Zernez through the beautiful landscapes of the Alps. You will pass through the Swiss National Park Engadin, past reservoirs, impressive valleys and high mountain passes. Grab your road bike and take part in what is probably the

This route covers 97 kilometers and covers 1,367 altimeters over three beautiful mountain passes, two of which cross the 2,000-meter mark. This is followed by the Bernina Pass with its magnificent glacial landscape. The subsequent rapid descent to Pontresina offers you a fantastic view of the railroad line of the Bernina Express, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and so back to Zernez.

### Sunday 06-07-2025 La Svizra - The queen stage Stage 3 - 117 km

For anyone looking for the ultimate challenge, the "La Svizra" route is a must. Over 117 kilometers you will bridge 2,815 altitude meters. The route starts in Zernez and leads over the Flüela pass to Davos, further through the Landwasser valley to Alvaneu. Then the long climb to the Albula Pass and the fast descent to La Punt and back to the Engadin valley awaits. This

queen stage on day three, tests not only your endurance, but also your mental strength. But the prospect of overcoming all the passes makes the race and your achievement something very special.

### More than a sporting event

The Engadin Cycling Marathon is much more than a cycling race. The varied preliminary program ensures that the experience off the course is not neglected. Look forward to culinary highlights such as pasta,



The eight picturesque vacation villages around the fortified town of Kufstein present themselves with steep climbs and mountain pass roads towards the Karwendel or Kitzbühel Alps. On the other hand, there is the Inntal where you can cycle leisurely rides on flat roads that lead all the way to Innsbruck, where the valley then turns into the Bavarian Alps. As an added bonus, cross-border tours between Bavaria and Tyrol await you, as the region also scores points for its proximity to the Bavarian Lake District.

But that's not all, as Kufsteinerland skillfully combines city & nature and cycling & culture. Here you cycle through remote mountain villages until you have exhausted yourself enough to then immediately descend to the center of Kufstein for a cup of coffee. There, after the bike rides, the diverse cultural program awaits.



### Varied choice of tours

From spring to late autumn, the Kufsteinerland offers good cycling conditions and a varied route network. Whether a visit to Hinterthiersee with impressive views of the Kaiser Mountains, flat stages to Rosenheim and Munich or cross-border tours through Chiemgau to Bernau am Chiemsee - there is something for everyone here. Meanwhile, leisure cyclists will appreciate the gently undulating routes through the

alpine foothills and along the Inn Valley, while ambitious riders will

### Where road cycling meets culinary delights

Kufsteinerland is a treasure trove, especially for foodies. The Kaiserweis gourmet bike routes, for

Impressive views of Pendling and the Kaiser mountains are guaranteed. Whether it's the marathon with over 120 km and 1,800 altimeters, the lake circuit with 95 km and 1,160 altimeters or the panorama circuit with 48 km and 400 altimeters: the three variants are a treat for everyone participating. Depending on the route, fast passages through the beautiful meadow landscape along the Inn alternate with tough climbs away from the valley, followed by descents into the villages around Kufstein. The start in the historic center of Kufstein is an impressive experience for participants and spectators alike. The crisp climbs to Lake Thiersee and the plateau near Bad Häring and Schwoich are sporting highlights that perfectly represent the Kufsteinerland cycling region. ### Biking through two protected natural parks



and downhill fun, the 52 km natural park trail is a gem in itself. If you still need some practice before setting off on your adventure in the Dolomites, you can brush up on your MTB skills at the Skills Park Cir, where even the very youngest bikers are guaranteed to have fun.

### The natural park trail: the Dolomites in their most pristine form

Only rarely can you experience the pristine Alpine space and high-alpine terrain so closely on narrow trails as on the nearly 52-km-long Fanes-Sennes-Prags Nature Park Trail.

Another great MTB adventure in the middle of the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Dolomites starts in San Vigilio. First, the route leads through the valley to the Pederü inn. This is the entrance to the high plateau of the Fanes-Sennes-Prags Nature Park. The steep climb to the Rifugio Fanes requires endurance, but rewards you with spectacular views. The 500 altimeters this 2,500-meter climb on a path with 21 hairpin turns will sometimes make you call on your mother, but once you have overcome them, the feeling is indescribable. After



a refreshing stop at 2,100 meters, the route descends to the pass road that connects Cortina d'Ampezzo to Dobbiaco. The descent to the Rifugio Fodara Vedla, a historic alpine pasture, eventually leads through breathtaking scenery and offers one last chance to immerse yourself in the untamed beauty of this landscape. From there we roll through the valley back to San Vigilio, accompanied by the silence of the mountains and the memories of a day full of highlights. Breathtaking panoramas, fascinating wildlife and the stories of times gone by make this tour a unique experience - a real privilege for anyone who wants to experience the Dolomites in their most authentic form.

#### **Our verdict on San Vigilio?**

The cycling region definitely deserves a pole position on the MTB bucket list. With the spectacular Dolomites on one side and the great Alpine main ridge on the other, the starting point for a mountain biking vacation with true WOW views coupled with historical and cultural richness could hardly be better!

Graveling here at 1,828 metres above sea level is pure fun. Endorphins and dopamine induced adrenaline and all the beauty around you. # DAVID COOLS from motocross rider to mountain biker

Cyclelive Magazine likes to pay attention to competitive categories lower on the pyramid of cycling competitions in addition to professional competitive cycling. Sometimes a story comes to our editors worthy of an article. Such is the case of mountain biker and former motocross rider David Cools.





# Born with two wheels in the stomach

The story of David Cools is one of many falls, getting up again and trying to get back to being competitive. But also the story of an avid motocross rider who was forced to love the bike and eventually fell head over heels in love with mountain biking.

When David was five years young he started competing in motocross and for the next 33 years that competition as a motocross rider never left him. He even became Belgian Champion in the Inters class six times. Yet David could never realize



his big dream of turning pro. Especially the many serious injuries took their toll, so he could never get everything out of his career. The last injury he suffered during his motocross career, seven years ago, put an end to his motocross story. The accident left him with a very serious fracture to the femur and hip that nearly caused Cools to lose his leg. Game over, resulting in a tough physical and mental rehabilitation. It immediately became the start of a new sports career on two wheels, but this time on mountain bike.

Cools started riding ATB competitions in the D-series and after two

years of tasting the competition he switched to the A-series. Gradually he looked for bigger and bigger challenges in higher competitions. This is how he ended up in the Flanders Cup, where he now gives his best in the Masters 2 series (45-54 yrs) and became the overall winner in 2024.

# David tell us a little bit about how you got from motorcycles to mountain bikes....

"Well after I realized that my motocross career was really over, I needed a new challenge and Dr. Toon Claes who operated on me gave it to me. My crash happened in May 2017 and I was given a year by Toon Claes to be at the start of La Cannibale (Mont Ventoux) in June 2018. I made it and finished the ride! In hindsight, this may have been a bit extreme as a first goal, but I have - and definitely needed - those extremes at the time. After that, I continued riding the course bike for a while, but that didn't give me enough satisfaction. That's why I started picking back up mountain biking, which I used to use a lot as physical training. At first I didn't want to ride races anymore at all, but after a local fun race I was bitten back by the competition bug and since then I have been com-



peting in MTB races almost every week."

#### So it was like a spark that got the engine going again that local race?

"Yes, during the CX competition that Geert Wellens organized here in Vorselaar until recently, there was always a series for people from Vorselaar. That's where I got the hang of it and the spark struck. Starting back, competing man to man, suffering and arriving completely broken, I had missed that hard...It may sound strange but that's when the real love for the bike started."

#### You come from the motorcycle world, are the two worlds similar?

"No those are different worlds, in the cross country world there is a lot of cycling as training but otherwise there is little to compare. Or at least one thing, you have to train really hard for both sports!"

## What drives you so fiercely to race?

"I just need that competition. I haven't done anything but race since I was little. I'm already looking forward to March when the season starts back."

# How have your results evolved over the past few years?

"The first seasons were really tough, I left like in cross, all or nothing, and it was then a lot of NIKS. I also had to learn everything and training I did without any know-how. Sometimes I lacked speed, then strength or explosiveness. Maddening. But that changed because with the help of Luc Van den Broeck from Concap and sports doctor Sam Vermeire, I got better year after year. This past

season 2024, after five years of growth, I was finally able to ride a very good and strong season without any dip or relapse. This year I won races in the Wallonia Cup, Luxembourg Cup, podiums in the 3nation races, final winner of the Flanderscup classification and what I am most proud of, a third place during the Belgian Champignonship marathon in La Roche."

# What are your ambitions for 2025?

"That I can have another year like this year. I've been good all year and everywhere I started I was competing for the podium. If I can match that or maybe do a little bit better, then 2025 will be successful again."

# What do your workouts look like, how many hours a week?

"I exercise every day: cycling, mountain biking, strength training and core stability, all come into play. In the winter I push the bike aside a little more and the focus is more on strength and stability. Then during the season it's more cycling, but I never skip the stability training. My body has suffered a lot during the MX career so keeping all the muscles strong is really a must! In the winter period I train about 15 hours a week. That also depends on the weather. During the season it is usually less, unless there is a specific goal to train for. But on average then I still train at least another 10 to 15 hours the week including the races."

# Are you also paying attention to your nutrition?

"I've always paid some attention to my nutrition but since this year I've been under nutrition guidance from Natacha Van den Broeck of Proti Balance/Concap. And that really made a big difference! She made sure that I was sharp for a whole year without being hungry and that there was no muscle breakdown, but even muscle gain. If you want nutrition guidance to perform better, you need to be with her!"

## Do you also take supplements then?

"Yes, for the supplements I am under constant supervision of Luc Van den Broeck who adjusts me with the Concap products where necessary. Every year I have my blood values checked several times by my doctor. Luc then advises me with the right supplements so I can perform optimally. During the season, some periods I even visit Luc weekly and then we discuss which races are on the program and adjust the supplements accordingly."

# So do the Concap products really help you that much? And how do you feel about it?

"Those help a lot, without the Concap products I would never have been able to compete at this level in mountain biking already. They give me strength, energy, better recovery and I hardly get sick any-

more. My level really went up a lot in a short time since I started using the products."

#### What kind of work do you do?

"My main profession is mailman but in independent secondary employment I am a motocross coach and personal trainer."

# How long do you think you will continue to do competition?

"As long as I can handle it physically. I think they'll have to bury me with my bike and all someday..."

(David laughs exuberantly)

# So is cycling without competition not an option for you?

"No, definitely not at the moment. But someday that will come about lol. I would like to put that off for a very long time though, by taking good care of myself and continuing to train hard."

Krka National Park, with enchanting natural features and unique cultural and historical heritage, covers an area of 109 km² with the most beautiful part of the course of the Krka River and the lower reaches of the Čikola River. The main natural phenomenon is tufa, which has formed seven beautiful waterfalls.

The spectacular scenes of the river are revealed to visitors on the hiking trails and cycling routes. Cycling along the trails of Krka National Park treats you alternately with the adrenaline rush of descending the steep slopes and the

tranquility of passing through the gentle valleys. Cycling here is also a direct insight into the wealth of flora and fauna of the rich land and water habitats.

There are three starting and ending points for all routes: the Krka National Park office in Skradin, the visitor center in Laškovica and the Krka Eco Campus in Puljane. There are a total of 12 cycling routes, including three MTB or mountain bike routes, three Road routes and six Track routes for enjoyable family rides. The routes have proper bicy-



cle tour markings and visitors can use detailed brochures with specific descriptions, photos, maps and GPS coordinates of the routes.

Cycling is a great way to explore and experience more distant parts of the park in a special way, and the upper reaches of the Krka River are ideal for this type of activity because of the configuration of the terrain. At the Krka Eco Campus in Puljane you can also rent electric bikes, called pedalec, booking in advance is recommended though.

#### 1. Donauradweg, 600 km

The Danube is exciting, varied, dreamy and relaxing at the same time. The Danube Bike Trail in Germany is just over 600 km long and can easily be cycled in individual day stages. Sporty or relaxing with the whole family - the Danube is the ideal cycling area for everyone. The Danube rises in the Black

Forest, in Germany, from the confluence of the Breg, the Brigach and the Donaubach, which rises in Donaueschingen. The bike route starts shortly at the source of the Donaubach in Donaueschingen. Just starting your tour where the longest river in the European Union begins is already an experience in itself.

Ending point: Passau

#### 2. Elberadweg, 1.300 km



You can read how Jonas Rickaert (Alpecin - Deceunicnk) and Arjen Livyns (Lotto-Dstny) enjoyed a cozy November weekend among friends here in Cyclelive Magazine.

# First, let's get to know these two pros.

#### **Jonas Rickaert**

Jonas Rickaert has been in the public eye before in the service of his leaders at Alpecin - Deceuninck. Jonas was born on February 7, 1994 and with his 1m88 and 85 kg he is the prototype of a perfect leadout. Behind his back you are really out of the wind and in a

perfect slipstream to attack, just ask Jasper Philipsen. Jonas is also active as a track cyclist, but is thus mainly known as the perfect locomotive for Mathieu van der Poel and Jasper Philipsen. He won the national race 'Zwevezele Koers' on Sept. 27, 2024. In 2020, with 'Dwars door het Hageland', he won his only UCI-1Pro victory to date.

#### **Arjen Livyns**


of the pond and the fruit meadow with cows. For the children it was great that the little calf kept coming back to watch curiously at the fence.
